## **GUIDE TO AUXMU QUALIFICATION**

### I. INTRODUCTION

Following typical Auxiliary PQS (Performance Qualification System) protocol, the Auxiliary Musician ("AUXMU") Qualification Program is the procedure to verify if a musician possesses the minimum criteria required to meet the AUXMU3, AUXMU2, AUXMU1 and/or AUXMU QE qualification. All Auxiliary qualifications (Boat Crew, coxswain, instructor, interpreter, VE, MDV, watch stander etc.) require a demonstration of capability witnessed by someone already qualified in order to complete the qualification. In the music world this is similar to a music adjudication.

There are three critical components to public music performance for AUXMU which must be demonstrated. They are:

- Wearing the Coast Guard Auxiliary uniform correctly
- Grooming conforming to the USCG Auxiliary requirements
- Musical performance meets a minimum quality threshold

The Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) establishes three levels of AUXMU plus the AUXMU QE (Qualifying Examiner). The three AUXMU levels (3, 2 and 1) are *modeled* off of the New York State School Music Association NYSSMA ratings (level 3, 4 and 5). The AUXMU ranking parallels other military and public affairs levels where "1" is the highest rating (e.g. Public Affairs Specialist 3 = "PA3" and Petty Officer 1<sup>st</sup> Class = "PO1"). The QE has achieved the highest quality standard (AUXMU1) and should have musical adjudication training such as that provided by NYSSMA or your state's equivalent. The first AUXMU QEs were qualified by members of the Coast Guard Band. The qualification signoff sheets for each AUXMU grade are in the AUXMU SOP. This guide clarifies some ambiguities that have been identified in the SOP and as well as additional detail and logistics for the AUXMU qualification. Updated signoff sheets that reflect these clarifications are provided in this guide as Attachments (B-E). Please use these in lieu of the ones in the SOP. ## II. DIRECTIONS & CLARIFICATIONS

- A. Validation of Mandatory Training Completion: Can be signed off by an AUXMU Mentor, qualified AUXMU at the level of qualification or higher, IS officer or FC. Confirmation that mandatory training is completed can be found by searching for the member in AUXOFFICER and confirm that MANDTR-Mandated Training appears under "Certifications."
  - **B.** Validation of having read the AUXMU SOP: Can be signed off by an AUXMU mentor or AUXMU QE after questioning the candidate on the contents of the SOP.



- 2. <u>Validate BQ Status</u>: Can be signed off by an AUXMU Mentor, qualified AUXMU at the level of qualification or higher, AUXMU QE or CG Bandsman. Confirmation can be found by searching for the member in AUXOFFICER and confirm that the member's status is BQ or higher. Note a member in AP status will not be promoted to BQ status until (a) Mandated Training is completed, (b) they passed an authorized boating safety class and (c) his/her background check is completed. Members in AP status may complete their AUXMU music qualification, but will not receive their AUXMU qualification until they achieve BQ status.
- 3. <u>Signoff for Uniform and Grooming Standards:</u> These signoffs can be made by an AUXMU Mentor, AUXMU at the level of qualification or higher, or AUXMU QE. The soloist and signoff authority should carefully refer to the USCG Auxiliary Manual for uniform and grooming standards (Chapter 10). A uniform and grooming checklist is provided in Attachment F of this guide. The soloist's uniform will be inspected for cleanliness and proper sizing. Full length photos of the front, back and both sides of the soloist in tropical blue uniform shall be taken by the signoff authority and submitted electronically as part of the AUXMU signoff. Photos that reveal uniform or grooming non-conformance will require a repeat sign off of this task.
- 4. <u>Signoff Counterparts:</u> If you have not completed all of your non-adjudication signoffs, you may still sit for the music adjudication portion. The AUXMU QE will send his/her signoff for the adjudication portion to the Auxiliary AUXMU QE Coordinator. After completing your remaining signoffs you can send your signoff sheet(s) (w/o the adjudication sections completed) to the same AUXMU QE Coordinator who will aggregate the two counterparts. The counterpart should be received within 3 months of the adjudication date or the soloist may be required to be re-evaluated.
- **5.** <u>Performance Uniform:</u> The soloist must wear an appropriate Coast Guard Auxiliary uniform to the qualification audition (tropical blue, winter dress<sup>1</sup>, or service dress blue).
- 6. <u>Music Performance Adjudication:</u> The adjudication is be conducted by an AUXMU QE (Qualifying Examiner) in person. A request for an adjudication appointment must be made via the AUXMU QE Coordinator (John Sasso) by submitting the AUXMU Qualification Exam Application (page 5 of this Guide). The adjudication is expected to last approximately 10-15 minutes. Larger percussion instruments required to complete the adjudication (xylophone, timpani, piano etc.) should be indicated on the appointment form. Every effort will be made to accommodate the request, subject to availability. However, a soloist who prefers to have accompaniment must provide their own accompanist or recorded/playback device and also indicate such on the appointment form.
- 7. <u>'Long Distance' Music Adjudications</u>: In person auditions are preferred at all times. Realizing that travel distances and budget constraints are a hindrance to the growth of the AUXMU program, once the AUXMU Qualification Exam Application has been received by the QE Coordinator and the solo title confirmed, the applicant may submit an unedited, digital video recording (DVR) on a disc of the applicant performing the indicated solo. The applicant must also include a printed copy of the solo music. The recording must conform to the following:

- a. the applicant fingers and face shall be visible 100% of the time while performing the solo, including
  pauses between movements sufficient to demonstrate to the AUXMU QE the applicant is actually
  playing the piece;
- b. the camera shall be mounted on a tripod and not move during the performance;
- c. The member's Auxiliary photo ID shall be legibly projected on the camera at the beginning of the taping

**Note**: The applicant's tone quality will be scored based on a recording; therefore it is highly recommended that the digital recording be of the highest quality possible.

The balance of the solo performance (scales and sight reading) will be coordinated via Skype or other real time simulcast between the AUMU QE and the applicant.

- 8. <u>Solo Performance:</u> The soloist may **not** have any guests present during the adjudication, except for a performing accompanist or videographer, if applicable. However, as part of the AUXMU QE qualification process, there may be more than one QE present.
- 9. **Recording the Adjudication:** Recording the Qualifying Exam (adjudication) is **NOT** allowed. You will be asked to turn off your cell phones to prevent recording and avoid interruptions during the adjudication.
- 10. <u>Solo Piece</u>: The solo piece should be prepared as per the NYSSMA level requirements. In case of multi-movement pieces, refer to the NYSSMA level listing for confirmation. The AUXMU QE may elect not to listen to the entire piece, but the QE must listen to no less than 30 seconds of the solo. The soloist must perform from an original version of the music and provide the same music for the QE.
- 11. <u>Unlisted Solo</u>: If the soloist desires to perform a solo piece that is not listed in the NYSSMA manual, the soloist must first provide a legible copy or digital copy of the entire piece to the District AUXMU QE Coordinator for review by a QE panel. Upon review by a QE panel (min 2 QEs) the solo will be assigned a music difficulty level (1-6). Allow adequate time to receive clearance for approval of an unlisted piece. Adjudication will not be scheduled until the solo's difficulty rating is confirmed.
- 12. <u>Scales</u>: All scales shall be one octave, even quarter notes, ascending and descending, performed at moderate tempo.
  - a. For AUXMU3: The soloist shall prepare to perform from memory 5 major scales. The QE will select 2.
  - b. **For AUXMU2**: The soloist shall prepare to perform from memory
    - i. 7 major scales. The QE will select 3.
    - ii. 3 natural minor scales, the QE will select 1.
  - c. For AUXMU1: The soloist shall prepare to perform from memory
    - i. 15 major scales. The QE will select 3.
    - ii. 5 natural minor scales, the QE will select 2.
- **13.** <u>Chromatic Scale:</u> The chromatic scale shall be one octave, even quarter notes, ascending and descending, at a moderate tempo, starting and ending on the same note of the soloist's choice.
- 14. <u>Sight Reading:</u> The QE will provide you with an 8 measure sight reading passage. Refer to the NYSSMA manual sight reading requirements for your instrument as to what can be expected for each level (key signatures, time signatures, rhythms, etc.). You will be given approximately one minute to study the sight



reading at the adjudication. A metronome will be available during the one minute study period. You will be given a tempo and the metronome will be turned off when you start the sight reading.

- 15. <u>Instrument, Stand and Accessories:</u> Soloist must provide his/her own instrument, music stand and accessories. It is expected that snare drum soloists will provide their own snare drum, but for larger percussion instruments, refer to item no. 6. Neck straps shall be of a conservative design, preferably solid black, to conform to uniform requirements.
- 16. <u>Multiple Instruments:</u> Auxiliarists that play more than one instrument must qualify separately on each instrument. "Separate instruments" would be consistent with how the instrument is listed in the NYSSMA manual. For example, alto sax, tenor sax, and baritone sax are considered separate instruments. Auxiliarists are strongly urged to qualify on their primary instrument first.
- 17. <u>Multiple levels/instruments</u>: Soloist may not qualify for different instruments or different levels during the same qualifying adjudication. Additional instruments and/or higher levels require separate adjudications. For example, not qualifying for AUXMU2 adjudication will <u>not</u> qualify you as an AUXMU3. This will require a separate audition on a future date.
- 18. <u>Minimum time period between auditions</u>: A candidate may apply for as many instruments and levels as they wish, with a recommended minimum of 2 weeks between qualifying exams.
- 19. **Qualifications Results**: The results of the qualifying exam will NOT be shared with the soloist at the conclusion of the exam. The AUXMU QE will send the results to the AUXMU QE Coordinator for review, verification and coordination with counterpart signoffs. The adjudication results will be sent to the soloist electronically at the email provided including a digital copy of the score sheet within approximately one week of the adjudication. Upon verification that all of the signoffs are completed, the AUXMU QE Coordinator will request DIRAUX to enter the AUXMU qualification into AUXDATA.
- 20. <a href="Pass/Failure">Pass/Failure</a>: The adjudication portion of the AUXMU qualification exam has a passing grade of 80% regardless of the level of difficulty performed. No extra consideration will be given for attempting to perform a more difficult solo than required. If the soloist did not pass the audition, the soloist can submit an application for another AUXMU qualifying exam. A different QE may be requested by the soloist for a repeat exam, if available.

## III. WHEN YOU ARE READY TO TAKE THE QUALIFYING EXAM

The qualifying exam (adjudication) may be taken at any time. It is only when all of the qualifications have been met, the paperwork signed, submitted, reviewed for completeness will the qualification be entered into AUXDATA. Qualification signoff sheets can be submitted to the AUXMU QE Coordinator in multiple parts, if necessary.

1. Complete Attachment A, "Aux Musician Qualification Exam Application Form" and send it electronically to the AUXMU QE Coordinator, John Sasso (<a href="mailto:jsasso@optonline.net">jsasso@optonline.net</a>). Allow approximately one to two weeks for processing.



- 2. If you are requesting to use an unlisted solo, submit a legible copy of the music solo prior to submitting the Exam Application Form and make sure you have received approval before submitting you Exam Application.
- 3. Once you receive your QE adjudication time, date and location, show up <u>early</u> and in uniform. Warming up and tuning are not included in the allocated time. Allow yourself ample time to warm up and tune before the adjudication.
- 4. Below is a checklist of things you should bring to the adjudication:
  - a. Your sheet music along with copies for the accompanist and AUXMU QE.
  - b. Your instrument and accessories such as mouthpiece, reeds, neck strap, tuner etc.
  - c. A portable music stand.
  - d. Wear the CG Auxiliary tropical blue uniform, winter dress uniform<sup>2</sup> or service dress blue uniform.
  - e. Your Aux Musician Signoff sheets [all pages] (Attachments B, C, D and/or E). If all of your other signoffs are not complete, keep your copy.
  - f. Qualification Exam Application Form (returned from the QE Coordinator).
- 5. Following the adjudication you will receive a copy of your score sheet electronically in approximately one to two weeks. If you did not complete all your other signoffs, you must send the remaining signoffs counterparts to the AUXMU QE Coordinator within three months of your adjudication.

### IV. DVR SOLO APPLICATION

If you are performing a listed solo, you can submit your unedited DVD to your QE Coordinator John Sasso, 31 Franklin Court, Northport, NY 11768. The DVD will not be returned. If you are proposing to perform an unlisted solo, a copy of the printed music should be submitted AND APPROVED prior to submitting the DVD disc.

The DVD disc should be readable by any commercial DVD device. The applicant must also include a printed copy of the solo music.

The recording must conform to the following:

- a. the applicant fingers and face shall be visible 100% of the time while performing the solo, including pauses between movements sufficient to demonstrate to the AUXMU QE the applicant is actually playing the piece;
- b. the camera shall be mounted on a tripod and not move during the performance;
- c. The member's Auxiliary photo ID shall be legibly projected on the camera at the beginning of the taping

- O No articles worn or carried exposed on the uniform. e.g. pencils, pens, watch chains or fobs, pins, handkerchiefs, combs, cell phones, eyeglasses, cigarettes, cigars, pipes and similar items.

#### **EYEWEAR**

 Frame and lens styles will be conservative and in good taste. Mirrored lenses are prohibited while in uniform.

### **RELIGIOUS WEAR**

- o No religious apparel visible,
- o Religious headgear does not cover the face, is black with no writing, and is completely covered when wearing the combination hat

### MEN'S HEAD HAIR

- Neat and clean
- Not touch the collar
- Not touching the ears

### MEN'S FACIAL HAIR

- Beards, sideburns, moustaches well groomed and neatly trimmed, not ragged.
- Moustache does not extend beyond the lip line
- No patches or spotty clumps of facial hair
- Bulk of beard not more 1 inch from the skin
